




Extracurricular & Volunteering IN YOUR HOMESCHOOL

Extracurricular activities are activities performed by students that fall outside the realm of the normal curriculum of school education. These activities are generally voluntary, non-paying, and tend to be social or philanthropic, as opposed to scholastic.

Extracurricular activities are a crucial part of a homeschooler's education, providing opportunities for informal and self-directed learning. Students should be motivated mainly by intrinsic interests, curiosity, exploration, task completion, and social interaction. These opportunities will allow them to develop as fully as possible while giving them the chance to sample a wide variety of experiences.

Education is not solely acquired through textbooks and academics. Through extracurricular activities and volunteering, students learn life skills that benefit them in school, the workforce, and life in general. Additionally, students can learn an incredible amount from their peers through these activities, such as how to compromise and work in a group. These activities also enable students to meet and interact with peers who may not be within their close group of friends. Moreover, these activities help enhance social skills and teach valuable lessons that may not be learned in a classroom setting.

These opportunities are also a great way to help homeschool students build their school portfolio as they submit college applications and apply for scholarships.

Extracurricular & Volunteering IN YOUR HOMESCHOOL
